

Non recyclable waste belongs in the Black Dustbin

- Cigarette-ends
- Ash
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Nappies
- Hygienic papers such as used paper, handkerchiefs, sanitary towels
- Soiled paper
- Wall-paper leftovers
- Broken porcelain and ceramics
- Worn out textiles and shoes
- Household articles made of plastic
- Dried wall-paint leftovers
- Toys
- Bags

The following things do not belong in the Re- maining Refuse Dustbin:

- Hazardous waste such as batteries, chemicals, oilcans, medicine, varnishes.
- Paper
- Glass
- Wrappings
- Biowaste such as food scraps, grass, branches

Attention!
Hazardous waste must be handed into the collecting vehicles for harmful substances. Dates and collecting points are given in the waste calendar.

Glass belongs in the Glass Container

- Bottles
- Preserving jars
- Jam jars
- Baby-food jars
- Drinking glasses

Please throw the glass into the Glass Container separately for white, brown and green glass!

The following things do not belong in the Glass Container:

- Ceramics
- Returnable bottles
- Porcelain
- Window-glass

Returnable bottles and glasses can be given back to the shops.

The recycling yards take back batteries, small electric appliances, corks, metals, tyres and many other things.

Instruction for Sorting out waste and materials in the household

A lot of waste is recycled and for that reason it should be collected separately.

The following things are part of the basic house equipment

- The Blue Paper Dustbin
- The Brown Bio-Dustbin
- The Black Remaining Refuse Dustbin
- The Yellow Bags

The different dustbins and the Yellow Bags are emptied/removed at fixed dates.

On no account is it permitted to put mixed waste into one dustbin!

In all parts of the town there are

- Glass Containers for white glass, green glass, brown glass
- Collecting points for garden waste

In nearly all towns and municipalities there are

- Recycling Yards for different kinds of waste

Bulky refuse is picked up at given dates.
Registration is necessary in Untertaunus!

Paper belongs in the Blue Dustbin

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Brochures and catalogues
- Exercise books
- Writing-paper and pieces of paper
- Cardboard boxes
- Egg-boxes
- Cigarette packets (only the box)
- Paper bags

The following things do not belong in the Paper Dustbin:

- Wrapping made of synthetic material, tin, aluminium
- Milk or drink cartons
- Juice cartons
- Nappies
- Used paper handkerchiefs and hygienic papers
- Wall-paper leftovers

Bio-waste belongs in the Brown Dustbin

- Vegetable, fruit and salad leftovers
- Potato skins and egg shells
- Spoiled food without wrapping
- Coffee filters and tea bags
- Cooked food leftovers
- Flowers and pot plants
- Grass, leaves
- Branches and twigs

Please pay attention !

Wrap wet kitchen scraps in newspaper or put them in paper bags (no plastic!) before depositing loosely in the Bio-Dustbin.

The following things do not belong in the Bio Dustbin

- Plastic bags
- Nappies
- Glass, metal, wood
- Vacuum cleaner bags, cigarette-ends
- Ash, rubbish
- Animal carcasses

Tip: Bio-waste can be put in your garden compost.

Collecting points for garden waste:
Branches · Twigs · Leaves · Shrubs

Wrappings made of synthetic material, metal or mixed material belongs in the Yellow Bags

- Plastic bottles, e.g. for washing-up liquid and cleaning liquid
- Plastic cartons, e.g. for yoghurt, cream and cottage cheese
- Plastic bags, e.g. for sweets or crisps
- Fruit and vegetable bags made of synthetic material
- Milk and juice cartons
- Cans for drinks and preserved food
- Empty aerosol cans
- Foils made of synthetic material and aluminium
- Flowerpots made of synthetic material

Yellow Bags are available at town halls and some groceries.

The following things do not belong in the Yellow Bags:

- Paper
- Glass
- Remaining refuse
- Textiles
- Shoes
- Toys
- Cleaning buckets
- Household articles
- Food
